Saturday 28 April Resistance (pg) Set in 1944 in German-occupied Britain, this is the story of the women of an isolated village who wake up to discover that their husbands have all mysteriously vanished to become part of the secret British resistance. With their sudden absence the women regroup as an isolated, all-female community and wait, hoping for news. When a German patrol arrives in the valley the severe winter forces the women to co-operate with them and a fragile mutual dependency develops. Based on Owen Sheers widely-acclaimed novel, much of the film was shot locally in the Orcop valley and on locations around Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Michael Sheen, Iwan Rheon, Andrea Riseborough

Saturday 26 May Tinker, Tailor, Soldier, Spy (15) Set in the 1970's, Tinker, Tailor, Soldier, Spy finds George Smiley (Gary Oldman), a recently retired M16 agent, doing his best to adjust to a life outside the secret service. However, when a disgraced agent reappears with information concerning a mole at the heart of the Circus, Smiley is drawn back into the murky field of espionage. Tasked with investigating which of his trusted former colleagues has chosen to betray him and their country, Smiley narrows his search to four suspects – all experienced, urbane, successful agents – but past histories, rivalries and friendships make it far from easy to pinpoint the man who is eating away at the heart of the British establishment.
